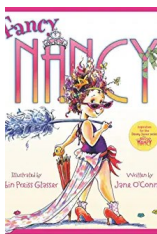

Harry the Dirty Dog–Gene Zion

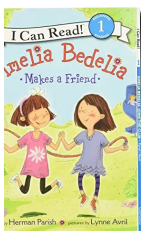

Fancy Nancy–I Can Read Beginning 1 Series

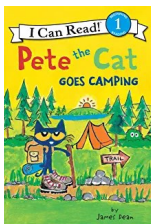
